# Sale of the field known as "Broad Halfpenny".

The above named field was purchased in 2003/2004 to give an alternative site to move to if the site at Viables was developed for housing as was rumoured at the time. However, now that a new ten-year lease for our current premises has been negotiated, it was agreed by a vote of members that it be resold. The offer by member Terry Hobbs to purchase the field was accepted by

a vote of members at the AGM and a postal vote of those members who were unable to attend and the sale is now ongoing and in the hands of the solicitors.

# Garden Railway by David Dowson.

When the preliminary plans were being put together for "Broad Halfpenny" there were proposals for a Garden Railway to form part of the development.

As the long term security of the Viables site became more certain, discussions started about developing the Garden Railway using Bob Skinner's 5" track as a base for a raised garden railway track.



Approval was sought from the Committee and work started in earnest in spring 2006 with a target for opening at the Gala Weekend in August. A lot of hard work by a number of members saw a track base formed with steel 5" track supports and a track bed of railway sleepers and ply decking. In order to provide comfort for those running trains or watching, benches and paths were installed to the steaming areas.

The track itself is a twin track of 'O' gauge and Gauge 1 track, approximately 75 feet running length with a minimum 12 foot radius which allows the running of narrow gauge and standard gauge trains and rolling stock.

The track was completed in time for the Gala weekend and provided a welcome attraction for those waiting to ride on the passenger carrying railway or those happy to sit and watch the trains go by.

At the Gala weekend, as well as club members running a mixture of gas or meths fired live steam locomotives, clockwork and battery powered locos in both 16mm/foot scale and O gauge.



We had visitors from the Southdown Railway Group (Fareham Model railway Club) running gas and meths fired British, American and European outline locomotives and stock. To see a standard Bavarian Railways Pacific loco and rake of coaches running at full speed was a sight to behold.

# **B&DMES** Clothing.

### The Logo.
